

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF LAC DU BONNET

BY-LAW NO. 11-09

BEING A BY-LAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF LAC DU BONNET FOR THE TEMPORARY CONTROL AND REGULATION OF VEHICLE TRAFFIC OVER ROADS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS Section 232(1)(d) and (m) of The Municipal Act, S.M. 1996, c.58 empowers a municipality to pass by-laws respecting municipal roads and local transportation systems;

AND WHEREAS Section 232(2)(e) of The Municipal Act, S.M. 1996, c.58, empowers a municipality to provide for a system of permits and approvals;



AND WHEREAS Section 236(1)(b)(ii) of The Municipal Act, S.M. 1996, c.58, authorizes a municipality to impose fines for bylaw contravention;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and expedient to restrict the weight of vehicles on municipal roads;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet in session assembled enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** all trucks be limited to 65% normal axle loads excluding front axle.
2. **THAT** water and sewer trucks be limited to 90% normal axle loading.
2. **THAT** under special circumstances, an access permit may be granted by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet to vehicles based on the Essential Commodities Provisions of Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation Spring Road Restriction Program Permit Exemptions and Permits Required List. Schedule "A".
3. **THAT**
 - (i) Every person who contravenes, or refuses, neglects, omits or fails to obey or observe any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a minimum fine of \$500.00 and a maximum fine not exceeding \$1,000.00.
 - (ii) If a contravention, refusal, neglect, omission or failure continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day it continues.
4. **THAT** school buses and emergency vehicles be exempt from this by-law.

Permit Exemptions List

The following commodities will not require a permit when transported under the conditions described earlier and specified in the Spring Road Restrictions Bulletins.

- a. livestock feed in transit as follows:
 - i. grain en route from producer to processor;
 - ii. unprocessed grain required for feed; and
 - iii. processed livestock feed
- b. hay for feed intra-provincially
- c. livestock in transit
 - i. to or from market or pasture, or
 - ii. as the result of a sale
- d. drinking water
- e. bulk milk
- f. seed in transit to supplier, farm or field
- g. groceries
- h. pharmaceuticals
- i. fuel
- j. fertilizer
- k. municipal refuse in transit to the nearest landfill site, and
- l. equipment and materials required for emergencies including forest fires, floods, train derailments, pipeline spills, etc.
- m. medical waste, blood products and blood services.

Permits Required List

The following commodities will require a permit. Permits may be issued only to prevent undue hardship or for economic necessity.

- n. contracts grain to satisfy grain quotas or
- o. potatoes or vegetables from producer to processor
- p. irreducible loads of heavy construction or industrial machinery
- q. pregnant mares urine
- r. fish
- s. crude oil

* Other request for permits will be considered, at the discretion of the R.M. in situations where it is determined to be in the public interest.
