1. Northeast Red Watershed District Presentation & Discussion

- Tree planting program through summer staffing, the district funds the trees, manpower and equipment to plant the trees.
- Provincial funding /Grow trusts money is in the trust. Annual funding. If someone had private property, we go through the district to divert it to retain it elsewhere.
- The district automatically receives annual provincial funding.

Action:

2. Wardrop Creek Drainage

- Discussion regarding jointly working with watershed district and maple creek/province.
- Allan Compensation package for all the drainage damage. Tracking all damage.
- Paul minister suggested off the record the only way to resolve maple creek is through litigation.
- Registered drains we need to maintain them.

3. Drainage & Grading

Gravel standards for the agriculture roads.

- Grading policy
- Gravel standard policy
- NW of Brightstone Orest Kaminski skimpy on gravel, not brushing roads, signs too close (dead end road) to the edge for farm equipment to pass/turn safely.
- Mower need wider and better mower like RM of Brokenhead.
- Ditch spraying Agassiz Weed District they spray chemical drift not considering the wind direction. And how close they spray to the field. Using the wrong sprayers but were changing the nozzles.

Action: Councilor Kellendonk & Deputy Reeve Mandzuk will bring spraying concerns

forward to Agassiz.

Action: David Atkins will touch base with Mr. Kaminksi regarding concerns and for site

visit.

4. Snowmobiling/Off-Road Vehicles

- Trespassing no off roads by-law POA would be able to ticket the trespassers.
- Education component people may not realize how this damages fields.
- **Billboards** sharing the roads with farmers, etc.
- Inserts newsletter website social media
- Sno-riders Club 325 km of trails on west side. Spend money on signage for everyone to stay on trails.

Action: Work w/ all the snowmobile clubs to communicate and to hear about where the

problem areas are.

Action: Set up Service Tracker category for snowmobile complaints.

5. Marketing

- Promote our strat plan with agriculture community.

Action: Communications Program - CAP/ Provincial Farmers program for communication on farm respect and promote strategic planning with agricultural components.

6. Transfer Station Fees

- Old pointe road lots of landfill dumps
- Chemical jug disposal sites provincial labels off, rinsing jugs for provincial pick up.
- Clean Farms pickup locations
- Grain bags not being recycled in Manitoba yet??

Action: Research Clean Farms program to facilitate the jug disposal pickups and grain bags.

Action: Review the Transfer Station By-law for Farm Properties. Currently, it is only farm properties that do not have a dwelling that have a "commercial – black card" and have to pay for using the TS. If they have a dwelling, they would have a white card and access to use the TS.

7. Development Plan

An update on status of Development Plan/Zoning By-Law RFP process which will be followed by many consultations.

8. Highways

- Keep pressure on MTI for highways that are being shared by farmers and traffic.
- Meeting with RCMP lobby for more enforcement.
- Road restrictions –
